Evangelizing and empowering through education on 3 levels:

- ❖ On the regional level through our Catholic schools in Saint Marc.
- ❖ On the community level through parish partnerships between the Archdiocese of Baltimore and the Diocese of Gonaives.
- ❖ On an individual level through group trips and exchanges between the U.S. and Haiti.

THE GOOD SAMARITANS SCHOOL

- Opened in 2001 in Saint Marc, Haiti
- Served K-9 through 2011, now serves K-6
- 472 students enrolled
- 39 Haitians employed

JAMES STINE COLLEGE

- January 2010 construction began in Saint Marc despite the earthquake's devastation in Port-au-Prince
- Opened September 2011
- Serves grades 7-13
- 430 students currently enrolled

NOTRE DAME DE LAMERCIE LITERACY SCHOOL

- Opened in 2002
- 83 enrolled in 2012
- 4 year cycle open to adults, especially to parents of Good Samaritan students

CARDINAL KEELER TRADE CENTER

- Opened in 2008
- Located in Gonaives, Haiti
- Offers trades such as carpentry, sewing, computer, electricity, auto-mechanic, and cooking

PARISH PARTNERSHIPS

- Since 2001
- 21 parishes partnered in Haiti
- 47 parish schools supported
- 23,000 Catholic school children fed daily

TRIPS TO HAITI

- Since 2003, over 100 youth from around the Archdiocese have participated
- 3 Archdiocese of Baltimore high schools are partnered with our schools in Haiti
- Adult volunteers assist with carpentry, electric, etc.
