MISSION ■ ■ ■ ■

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal helps sustain the essential ministries of the Archdiocese of Baltimore including those that provide direct ministry – African American ministry, Hispanic ministry, Prison ministry, Hospital ministry, and Respect Life ministry, to mention a few, and administrative areas which provide supportive services to parishes and schools, as well as our outreach agency partners, including Catholic Charities of Baltimore.

Once a year, Catholics throughout the Archdiocese of Baltimore are asked to support these ministries by giving to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. Donor participation plays a key role in advancing the mission of the Church both within and beyond the boundaries of their parishes. The good news is that the 2015 Archbishop's Annual Appeals saw an increase in donor participation for the first time in several years. We attribute this increase to the winding down of the *Embracing Our Mission* capital campaign, which, while it ran concurrently with the Appeal, sometimes asked the same donors to support dual fundraising initiatives within the same calendar year. As we move beyond the capital campaign, our hope is to continue to grow Appeal participation.

GOALS = = = = =

Parish Goals

Every parish in the Archdiocese of Baltimore is given a financial goal for the 2016 Archbishop's Annual Appeal.

Financial Goal

All parishes are asked to raise a minimum amount of the equivalent of 9% of offertory based on the FY14 parish financial reports. This calculation is used to set all parish goals.

Donor Goal

Although not formally stated, increased participation will help a parish reach its financial goal sooner and more efficiently. But more importantly, increased participation is an opportunity to invite parishioners to a deeper relationship with Christ by supporting the ministries that spread the Gospel in your parish and throughout the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

The suggested percentage of donor participation at a parish can vary, but the national average regarding donor participation averages between 20-26%. For 2015, the overall AOB Appeal participation rate was 17%, leaving opportunity for great improvement. It should be noted that many parishes in the AOB and other Catholic dioceses exceed this rate. We ask that pastors be mindful of their individual parish participation rate which is indicated on the AAA In-Progress Report found on the Appeal website at <u>www.archbalt.org/appeal</u>.

Archdiocesan Goals

The 2016 Archbishop's Annual Appeal has an overall goal of raising \$9 million in funds. All parish goals are public and are listed on the Archbishop's Annual Appeal In-Progress Report found on the website at <u>www.archbalt.org/appeal</u> under "NEWS" and "PROGRESS REPORTS".

THE APPEAL AT WORK

The vital programs and services provided by the Archdiocese of Baltimore serve 145 parishes in 66 cities and towns, 68 Catholic elementary and secondary schools, and thousands of Catholics throughout the Archdiocese. The Appeal is funded through the generosity and commitment of those who believe in these ministries and want to ensure that they remain strong.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS • • • •

Theme

This year's Appeal theme is A Light Brightly Visible.

Advance Planning Phase

During the Planning phase, parishes should select a lay volunteer to be Archbishop's Annual Appeal Co-Chair. All Pastors, Appeal Co-Chairs, and Appeal team members should plan on attending a training session in January.

Before the 2016 Archbishop's Annual Appeal is publicly announced on Announcement Weekend, the Appeal Office sends solicitation letters signed by Archbishop Lori to all previous Appeal donors. These donors are invited to make a generous pledge in advance of Commitment Weekend to encourage a strong public launch. Many parishes see great success due to advance phase efforts. One such effort, new for 2016, is the addition of Regional Leadership Receptions. These receptions will offer our leading donors a chance to meet and speak with Archbishop Lori in a more intimate setting while providing the Archbishop with an opportunity to express again his gratitude for their past support and to more fully flesh out his vision for our Archdiocese with those donors most likely able to bring it to fruition.

Launch Process

Three-Weekend Launch Strategy

Announcement Weekend

The goal of Announcement Weekend is to educate parishioners on the importance of the Archbishop's Annual Appeal and to ask them to prayerfully discern how they will support this year's Appeal.

Commitment Weekend

During Commitment Weekend, parishes should play the Archbishop's brief audio or video homily (depending on parish AV capabilities). Pastors or a designated volunteer will also carry out the In-Pew pledge presentation at every Mass. Through this presentation, more parishioners will be given the opportunity to participate in your 2016 parish appeal.

Follow-up Weekend

During Follow-up Weekend at every Mass, lay ministers/guest speakers will give a presentation (including a testimonial on the Appeal and a run-through of the In-Pew process). Parishioners will again be given the opportunity to participate in the In Pew process.

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal launch strategy will help parishes:

- Secure pledges earlier many parish leaders have expressed a strong desire to close their parish Appeal and reach goal by June 30, 2016. A strong and enthusiastic In-Pew Solicitation process will go a long way forward meeting this goal.
- Grow participation rates In 2015 the In Pew participation rates have increased for the first time since 2010. In Pew amounts have increased by \$1 million as compared to 2014. If parishioners understand the importance of the Appeal, more will participate.
- Increase pledge or gift amounts by inviting <u>all</u> parishioners to make a pledge (payable in installments), families often choose to give a higher amount than if giving through a one-time donation. During the In-Pew period, parishioners are given the option to commit to installments over a 8-month timeframe. Pastors are asked to encourage everyone to make a gift according to their means. It's important to have as many people participate in the Appeal as possible. Therefore, if families are unable to make pledges over a 8 month timeframe, one time gifts for new donors or lower level donations are encouraged.

Post Launch

Parishes will complete the donation summary sheets and send all In-Pew envelopes to the Archdiocese of Baltimore utilizing the pre-paid Fed Ex envelopes and labels. **Please do not hold envelopes**. Mailing them as close to the completion of the Commitment and Follow-up Weekends will ensure more timely processing and follow up with donors.

ADVANCE PHASE **■■■**

Complete Materials Request Forms and Meets with Regional Directors

All parishes are asked to complete a parish spending plan, Appeal team contact sheet and Appeal training registration. Completing these forms are the most effective way to communicate your parish's needs for your 2016 appeal to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal office.

Select a Parish Appeal Co-Chair

The Appeal invites parishioners to a deeper experience of the work of the Church within their parish community and the greater Catholic family in the Archdiocese. Although the Pastor's participation is essential to a successful parish Appeal, so is the participation of an Appeal Co-Chair. We strongly encourage you to recruit an Archbishop's Annual Appeal Co-Chair. Prior Appeal cycles show that parishes with an Appeal Co-Chair are more likely to reach goal.

The ideal Appeal Co-Chair is a volunteer, donor to the Appeal, insightful, and well-respected in the parish community. The most effective Co-Chairs lead Appeal efforts in the following ways:

- Witnessing from the pulpit at all Masses on a specified weekend (whatever fits best with your parish Appeal schedule) by explaining why he/she supports the Appeal and encouraging fellow parishioners to participate in the Church's universal call to help those in need.
- Joining and assisting the Pastor in any personal outreach to individual parishioners or families, requesting their support of the Appeal.
- Giving generous support to the Appeal, preferably prior to the launch of the parish Appeal.
- Participating in Archdiocesan regional trainings or on-site trainings in January.

Members of the Appeal Office can help you identify and recruit an Appeal Co-Chair. For assistance or questions regarding Appeal Co-Chairs, please contact your Regional Director.

Review Last Year's Results and Plan for a Successful 2016 Appeal

Review both financial and donor results from the 2015 Archbishop's Annual Appeal. What worked well? What could be improved upon? Renew activities that were successful and consider adding new strategies including:

- Invite a Lay witness from the parish to talk about the Appeal during Mass or arrange with the Archdiocese for guest speaker if preferred
- Highlight a ministry funded by the Appeal in your weekly bulletin
- · Participate in sending thank you letters once gifts are made
- Hold a monthly, quarterly Mass to thank donors
- Mail a final letter to LYBUNTs (Last Year but Unfortunately Not This). All prior direct mail requests have come from the Archbishop. This is an opportunity for Pastors to ask those yet to give to support the Appeal. The Appeal Office will provide you with these names.
- Try other ideas that would work well in your parish. *Please share successful ideas with the Archbishop's Annual Appeal team.*

In the event parishioners have questions, Pastors and Appeal Co-Chairs are encouraged to become familiar with all of the Appeal materials.

Send Email Solicitation to Leadership and Close Friends of the Parish

Pastors are encouraged to email (we will provide you with the email to forward) those closest to the parish and ask for their early support of the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. The e-mail should be sent to members of the Pastoral team, parish council, finance council, and parish volunteers and will ask them to pledge their early support to help build momentum for a successful parish launch. Beginning February 2, parish donor reports will be available on the Archbishop's Annual Appeal website so that progress toward goal can be announced on Commitment Weekend.

KICKING OFF YOUR APPEAL

Announcement Weekend

The goal of Announcement Weekend is to educate parishioners on the Archbishop's Annual Appeal and give them an opportunity to learn how the Appeal directly supports their parish.

For a successful Announcement Weekend, please be sure the following occurs:

Make an announcement about the Archbishop's Annual Appeal during Mass. The announcement should encourage parishioners to prayerfully discern how they are being called to support the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. If possible, the Archbishop's Annual Appeal Co-Chair or other lay volunteer may offer a personal witness during Mass.

A sample announcement appears below:

Next weekend, **PARISH NAME** will launch our 2016 Archbishop's Annual Appeal parish campaign. With the support of the Archbishop's Annual Appeal, the Archdiocese of Baltimore provides pastoral, educational, and charitable ministries to parishes and families throughout the Archdiocese.

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal is the most effective way we support the mission of the Archdiocese of Baltimore and strengthen our own parish family. The ministries supported by the Archbishop's Annual Appeal directly impact what we do here, at **PARISH NAME**. We also rely on the Parish Share Rebates which provide **PARISH NAME** the additional funds to support...

Swap ministry offices out as appropriate and relevant to your parish:

Parish operating needs, capital improvement projects, tuition assistance which helps our parishioners pay for a Catholic School education. The Appeal also helps strengthen our parish partners (name partners), and allows us continue to grow our Youth Ministry Programs. Your support of the Archbishop's Annual Appeal allows our Director of Religious Education and catechist team the training and support they need. Through the assistance of Youth and Young Adult ministries, we have a vibrant youth group that has attended World Youth Day and the annual Walk for Life in Washington, DC. We also count on the use of the Msgr. O'Dwyer Retreat House to host our young adult enrichment retreats. These are just a few ways our parish is impacted by the Archbishop's Annual Appeal.

- Include the Archbishop's Annual Appeal Insert in your bulletin. If your parish has FATA the bulletin will already be inserted; if not the bulletin insert will be mailed to you. This is the primary educational piece regarding the Appeal.
- Prominently display posters. To create awareness of the Archbishop's Annual Appeal, please hang Appeal posters in high-traffic, high-visibility locations in your Church.

WHAT? COMPLETE? Include the Prayer of the Faithful at masses Include Archbishop's Annual Appeal Insert in bulletin. Display Appeal Posters Include Archbishop's Annual Appeal Insert in bulletin.

Announcement Weekend Checklist:

Commitment Weekend

The ability to reach your parish goal and increase donor participation relies heavily on how effectively you execute Commitment Weekend, and in particular, the In-Pew presentation. Here are some helpful tips on how to successfully perform the In-Pew Presentation:

- Supply the church with plenty of In-Pew pledge forms ahead of Commitment Weekend.
- Play the Archbishop's audio/video homily. The text of the homily appears in the back of this training manual and will eventually appear on the Appeal website. There is no need for an additional homily.
- After the Archbishop's homily, have volunteers distribute In-Pew pledge forms and golf pencils. One form should be distributed to each household present. While the ushers are distributing the forms, the Pastor can begin the script (next page).
- Perform the In-Pew presentation during Mass. The In-Pew Appeal works best when parishioners are asked to make a commitment while at Mass. In cases where scheduling prevents the Pastor from being present at every Mass, the Celebrant or Appeal Co-Chairs may lead the In-Pew presentation. Every household present is asked to complete a pledge form regardless of how they plan to give (online, through letter #1...etc. or if they have already given).
- Remember to present the Archbishop's Annual Appeal as an invitation and not an apology. The Archbishop's Annual Appeal is a wonderful opportunity for parishioners to support their faith, parish, and Archdiocese. Let parishioners make their own decisions about their ability to support the Appeal this year.
- Collect completed In-Pew pledge forms during Mass. Have ushers, religious education students, or other volunteers assist in collecting completed forms during Mass.
- Pastor and volunteers should remain after Mass to answer Appeal questions.

In-Pew Presentation Script

Immediately following Archbishop Lori's recorded homily, the Pastor or volunteer should begin the In-Pew presentation. If you have already provided envelopes and pencils in the pews, the Pastor need only be sure that one member of each household has them.

We suggest that the Pastor personalize the following script, print it in 16-point type, and have it available in the pulpit before Mass.

PASTOR IN-PEW PRESENTATION (Commitment Wknd)

"Good morning. Today we are conducting the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. The Appeal asks all parishioners to make a financial commitment to the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

"As your Pastor (PLD), I want to thank all of you who have given to this Appeal in past years. I can assure you that the funds you gave are deeply appreciated by the people served through the many ministries funded through the Appeal, including our parishioners here at PARISH NAME.

"Each of us is called to share his or her gifts in support of the Church. We must first support our parish and then our Archdiocese and the Church throughout the world. The Annual Appeal of the Archdiocese of Baltimore is a very effective way to support ministries outside of our parish boundaries, as well as to support the services that the Archdiocese provides to our parish.

"So, I ask one member of each household to take a pledge envelope and a pencil as it is passed down the pew even if you have already given in the mail or cannot give at this time. You can indicate either of those choices on the envelope."

(Pause and make sure that everyone has received a pledge envelope and pencil. Pay special attention to people who are standing and in the cry room or choir loft and don't forget the members of the choir. Once everyone has an envelope, continue with the script.)

"I am going to guide you through the process in order to minimize the time that it takes.

"Now, please open the flap and find the pledge form and the pencil."

(Pause and wait until about half of those participating are looking back at you.)

"Please print your first name and your last name on the top line."

(Pause and wait until about half of those participating are looking back at you.)

"On the second line, please print your spouse's first name and last name if it is different from yours."

(Pause as above.)
```

"On the third line, please print your address including any unit or apartment number. If you have recently changed addresses, please mark the new address box."

(Pause as above.)

"On the fourth line, please print your city, state, and zip code."

(Pause as above.)

"On the fifth line, please print your preferred telephone number and your preferred email address."

"Good morning, my name is NAME and I'm grateful to PRIEST NAME for this opportunity to speak with you today about the Archbishop's Annual Appeal.

On behalf of PRIEST NAME I'd like to begin with a special thank you to those of you who supported the Appeal last year. In 2015, NUMBER parishioners contributed AMOUNT to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. A wonderful result by any measure!

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal is the Archdiocesan equivalent of our weekly offertory here at PARISH NAME. It provides the vital means that permit Archbishop Lori and the many ministries of the Archdiocese to carry out their work. It is the financial "oxygen" without which the work of the larger Church would be impossible.

These ministries have a profound influence on the lives of so many by helping to pass on our faith to young, new Catholics, by supporting the priests, deacons, seminarians and other religious and all those who offer their lives to serve us. These ministries make our parishes, our schools and our many agencies more efficient and effective through the training and support services they provide to local parishes and Pastors.

On a personal level, my wife and I have been PARISH NAME parishioners for almost 50 years. To be sure, I took PARISH NAME for granted thinking there was always a Church and there were always priests—that the sacraments were there whenever we wanted or needed them. COMPLETING YOUR PARISH APPEAL

After Follow-Up Weekend

The first weekend after Follow-Up Weekend, parishes should notify parishioners during Mass that if they missed the opportunity to pledge over Commitment Weekend, they can make a gift online at <u>www.archbalt.org/appeal</u> or by completing an In-Pew pledge form available in the back of the Church.

Please note that parishes should continue to send any pledge forms collected after Follow-up Weekend to the AOB Gift Processing Office.

Support from the Archbishop's Annual Appeal Office

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal Office has developed enhanced strategies to help your parish meet goal earlier including:

- **Monthly pledge reminders.** Parishioners who make pledge commitments will receive monthly reminders throughout the Appeal.
- Administering an email campaign. Donors and prospects will receive 3-4 emails throughout the Appeal from Archbishop Lori and ministry leaders requesting support. Emails will be spaced appropriately and allow recipients to opt out if requested.
- Providing regular updates to parishioners through the bulletin announcements. Individual parish updates will be posted on www.archbalt.org/appeal under "News" and "Progress Reports."
- Follow up mailings and phone calls. Parishioners who support the Appeal in the past, but have not yet made a gift or declined participation may receive follow-up solicitations or phone calls.

Stewardship

Thanking donors is one of the most important elements of your parish Archbishop's Annual Appeal. It will positively impact your parish's current and future Archbishop's Annual Appeal campaigns. Furthermore, thanking donors is another way you can strengthen your relationships with families and individuals in your parish.

Although the Archbishop's Annual Appeal donors are promptly thanked by Archbishop Lori, we recommend that your parish also send a thank you letter from the Pastor and/or Appeal Co-Chair. A suggested thank you letter template can be found in the Appendix in the back of this document.

Updating Parishioners on Results

Share the great news of Appeal success with parishioners. Use bulletin and Mass announcements to update the congregation on the progress of the Appeal. Invite the Parish Appeal Co-Chair or other Lay Witness to provide brief updates and to ask for support. Appeal talking points can be found in the Appendix in the back of this document.

Special Masses and Events

In addition to thanking donors, it's helpful to make donors feel connected to the ministries they are supporting and to help them feel appreciated. We recommend offering Mass for donors to your parish Archbishop's Annual Appeal campaign once a month. This is another wonderful way to thank your donors and express your profound appreciation for their sacrifice and support.

Appeal Recognition

Donors of \$2,500 and above, Appeal team members, and Pastors will be invited to attend an appreciation liturgy and reception with Archbishop Lori in December 2016.

DO NOT OPEN OR SORT THE SUBMITTED IN-PEW ENVELOPES. PLEASE DO NOT SEPARATE THE CONTRIBUTION FROM THE ENVELOPE.

- 1. Place the unopened envelopes, donation summary report, and any loose checks (checks not in an envelope) into the overnight envelope(s) provided. Record the number of envelopes enclosed in the Fed-Ex bag on the summary report.
- 2. Loose bills and change (dollar bills and/or change not in an envelope) should be counted and deposited into your parish account.
- 3. Write a check for that amount to the *"Archbishop's Annual Appeal"* and place it in an envelope marked "Loose Change Check" and record it on the Donation Summary Report.
- 4. Contact Federal Express and request a pickup of the envelope(s) or place the envelope(s) in a FedEx Drop Box NO LATER THAN THE WEDNESDAY after each In-Pew Appeal Process.

All shipping charges will be billed to the Appeal directly. Please ship the envelope(s) and the documents by the WEDNESDAY after the In-pew process on Commitment Weekend and by the WEDNESDAY after the In-pew process on Follow-Up Weekend. Failure to return the documents timely may result in incorrect application of donor payments to pledges.

Archdiocesan Gift Processing Procedures

All gifts to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal, whether they are received through the mail or through In-Pew Weekend collection baskets, will be processed as swiftly as possible. Once a gift is received, the following actions will occur:

- 1. Each pledge card will be processed, capturing the following information:
 - Donor's name, address, and parish
 - Pledge amount indicated
 - Total commitment and number of payments
 - Amount of gift enclosed, if any
 - Gift designation, if any
- 2. The gift will be deposited and the information added to the parish and individual giving record.
- 3. All donors who make a gift or pledge will receive an acknowledgement, a postcard for donations \$20 and under, and a letter from the Archbishop for all gifts or pledges over \$20.
- 4. Parishioners who make a pledge to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal and spread their gift out over a certain number of payments will be sent monthly reminders (except for credit card pledges, the fulfillment of which will be made by credit card deductions on or around the 15th of each month). In all follow-up mailings, individuals will be instructed to send their gift through the mail. If, however, some individuals place their monthly payment envelopes in the parish collection basket, the parish should simply forward them to the Development Department.
- 5. Parish checks to the Appeal, loose change or cash, will be credited to the particular parish.

What is the Archbishop's Annual Appeal?

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal is an annual effort to raise the critical funds needed to continue operation of the essential ministries in the Archdiocese of Baltimore. 1. How much should a parish family contribute to the 2016 Archbishop's Annual Appeal?

While this is a private decision, it is appropriate to ask a person to consider a particular gift level. Many households contribute 2% or 1% of their income; some are able to do more, and some less. Each family must make its own decision. Asking parishioners to trust in the Lord and to do what God asks of them is always appropriate. Above all, we ask for prayers in support of the work of the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

- 2. Why give to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal when my parish needs money, too? We hope parishioners will support both. Parish support helps to sustain the direct expenses incurred by the parish. Through the Appeal, Catholics support additional programs and services that are essential to parishes and that also help carry out the work of the Church beyond parish boundaries. Both need our support.
- 3. What should I do if parishioners do not understand the benefits of the Appeal? As Pastor, your personal witness is the most compelling message. Therefore, it is best that you speak to the support that you and your parish receive of which your parishioners may not be aware. Many parish based programs and services would not be available without the Appeal. We are one Church, and our ministries and programs serve our parishes and many others in need.

Archbishop's Annual Appeal Homily 2016 "A Light Brightly Visible"

I. Introduction

My dear friends, I take this opportunity today to appeal, once again, to your generosity in support of the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. The theme for this year's campaign is "A Light Brightly Visible". This theme is taken from my recently-issued pastoral letter of the same title, which I wrote to highlight what our local Church needs to do in order to thrive and serve all people who live in its boundaries. The mantra that we need to continually reflect on is: "It is not *whether* we will be present, but *how* we will be present." One of the ways that we, as members of the Church of Baltimore, are able to be present and serve countless people is through the Archbishop's Annual Appeal.

- II. A Light Brightly Visible
- A. In the Second Vatican Council's document on the Church, Lumen Gentium, the Synod Fathers proclaimed that the Church reflects the light of Christ by "proclaiming the Gospel to every creature".
 Jesus came for all people and His mandate to the Apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations", is a mandate for all of us as well. Every situation in which we find ourselves, whether it is among our family members or friends, at work, or in society in general, presents us with an opportunity to preach, by word and by action, the Gospel message.
 It is a chance for us to share the light of Christ that is within every one of us as a baptized Catholic Christian.

B. In Matthew's Gospel Jesus told those gathered around Him, "You are the light of the world...your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."
In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus was speaking to ordinary people.
Today, we are the light of the world and God wants to accomplish His work through each one of us.

We are called to look outward - away from ourselves and out toward the poor and helpless and to those who live on the margins.

- III. Pope Francis' Challenge
- A. Months later, we are still fondly remembering the historic visit of Pope Francis to our country.

We remember the joy and excitement we felt seeing the Holy Father celebrate Mass, embracing children with disabilities, visiting the sick, the homeless, and the imprisoned, and greeting cheering crowds of thousands. But we cannot let our memories linger only on the feel-good aspects of the Holy Father's visit.

Do we remember his challenging words to us about accompanying those who suffer, the poor, and the needy in our midst?

Do we remember the Pope's call to look outwardly and to love outwardly? During his homily in Philadelphia at the concluding Mass for the World Meeting of Families, Pope Francis said, "Would that all of us could be open to miracles of love to benefit our own families and all the families of the world, and thus overcome the scandal of a narrow, petty love, closed in on itself, impatient of others!"

How are we answering the Pope's challenge to us?

B. The Archbishop's Annual Appeal affords us the opportunity to look and to love beyond ourselves.

The Appeal supports numerous programs and ministries in the Archdiocese of Baltimore such as: Catholic Charities, Evangelization, Prison Ministry, Catholic Education, and Vocations, to name but a few. As you consider your gift to the 2016 Archbishop's Annual Appeal, I ask you to ponder how your contribution will benefit vital ministries in parishes, or the thousands of men and women who seek a hot meal from Catholic Charities, or the families who struggle to keep their children in Catholic schools.

These are all ways that we as a Church demonstrate our love and solidarity with the needy and suffering in our midst.

- C. Pope Francis once said, "The contribution of the Church in today's world is enormous...[Christians]...devote themselves to the education of children and young people. They take care of the elderly who have been forgotten by everyone else. They look for ways to communicate values in hostile environments. They are dedicated in many other ways to showing an immense love for humanity inspired by the God who became man." May we be this kind of Church in the Archdiocese of Baltimore.
- IV. Conclusion
- A. Pope Francis continually invites us to show our love for Jesus in our love for our neighbor, especially those who are poor and needy.
 I ask you to please join me in participating in the 2016 Archbishop's Annual Appeal.

Through our generosity to our neighbors, we demonstrate our love for God and express our gratitude for the blessings we have received.

Together, let us be a light brightly visible, illuminating the way to heaven.
