TO JOIN THE REGISTRY YOU MUST BE IN GOOD HEALTH AND BETWEEN THE AGES OF 18 AND 44.

WHEN YOU JOIN THE REGISTRY YOU COMMIT:

- To be listed on the registry until your 61st birthday, unless you ask to be removed.
- To consider donating to any searching patient who matches you.
- To keep the registry updated with address or health changes.
- To respond quickly if you are contacted as a potential match.

WHEN YOU JOIN THE REGISTRY AT THIS DRIVE, YOU WILL BE ASKED:

- To fill out and sign a Consent Form.
- To provide a simple cheek swab that will be tissue typed and sent to the universal donor registry.
