

Profile: Bishop Walsh School is proudly named after Bishop James Edward Walsh, M.M., a Cumberland native whose lifetime of service in South China resulted in 12 years of imprisonment by the Communist Chinese government.

Bishop Walsh left for China in June of 1918. He became the Bishop for Kongmoon in 1927 and served as the Superior General of Maryknoll, New York from 1936 to 1946. Returning to China, he was imprisoned in Shanghai from 1958 to 1970.

Our high school was dedicated in his honor in 1966. Bishop Walsh was freed in July of 1970 and shared a joyous dedication in his honor in Cumberland later that year. He died at Maryknoll on July 29, 1981. The Walsh family remains active in the community and as a part of our school family. Bishop Walsh School has built its reputation on a firm foundation of parochial education in Western Maryland and the area. The proud traditions of LaSalle High School, Catholic Girl's Central High School, St. Mary's High School, St. Peter's School and the Ursuline Academy have had profound influences on the presence of Catholic Education

in this region, and these alumni/ae are still dedicated to the future of a Catholic school presence as a choice for educational excellence.

Bishop Walsh serves a diverse population from 3 states and maintains a high academic standard for all students in grades PreK through 12.





Curley is a college-preparatory school focused on building the whole person through a stratified curriculum, 13 interscholastic sports, performing and visual arts programs, and a well-balanced offering of co-curricular activities. The diverse student body is drawn from a large metropolitan area.

Tuition Assistance / Scholarships: The Financial Aid program, in the form of grants and work-study, is aimed at students who demonstrate satisfactory academic achievement and financial need based upon family resources and obligations. Requests for financial assistance are initiated by obtaining a copy of the Private School Aid Service's Student Aid Form from the Business Office of Archbishop Curley High School after November 5, 2011.

Academic Programs: *The Franciscan Program* is an interdisciplinary program for students to participate in honors level courses, which emphasize effective speaking and writing skills. *The Cupertino Program* is a college preparatory academic program for students working at the appropriate grade level. A student's placement within the program is evaluated on a regular basis to ensure a challenging and appropriate curriculum. *The Anthony Program* is a multifaceted college preparatory program that addresses the needs of young men of diverse backgrounds who are at risk for academic difficulties due to a learning difference, lower self-esteem, and/or socio-emotional issues. Maximum learning potential is achieved through the implementation of cross-curricular behavioral strategies, individualized assessments to measure academic performance, and most importantly, an integrated team-teaching approach.

Transportation: Many students carpool to Curley. Bus service is available from Harford and Anne Arundel Counties; the cost of the bus service is \$1,100 per year.

Academic Scholarships: These partial scholarships are awarded annually based on outstanding academic performances and achievements. All applicants are eligible for consideration.

Special Programs: *The McMullen Scholars Program* is a comprehensive, four-year, integrated program intended to provide academically gifted students with a scholarly liberal arts education with specialized academic and college advising. Students are required to take honors and Advanced Placement courses, to participate in field experiences at local museums and theatres, and to complete an independent research project in their senior year. The program will enable a student to integrate the knowledge he receives in all academic disciplines and correlate this knowledge to the study of humanities.

TWO TESTING DATES – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

- In order to be considered for admission to any participating Catholic high school, 8th grade students must take the High School Admissions/Placement Test (HSPT) given on December 3, 2011 OR December 10, 2011 (see page 29 for the list of schools offering HSPT). The cost of the test is \$30.00, payable in cash, on the test date. Registration for the test begins at 8:30 a.m. The test will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m. (Results of this test will be mailed by the Scholastic Testing Service (STS) directly to each student's residence.) Students may take the test at any Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic high school on the dates listed above, however the test may be taken only once. Test results can be sent to three Catholic high schools. In the case of inclement weather, visit our web site or tune in to WBAL 1090AM for instructions.
- Catholic elementary school students are given a standard Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic High School Information Form. This form is given directly to the students in Catholic elementary schools by personnel at their respective schools no earlier than Thanksgiving Week, Nov. 21 - 25, 2011. (See page 28 for specific details on completing this form.)
- 3. All Catholic high schools require an individual application. These applications, completed by the students and/or parents/caregivers, are requested directly from the high school by the student or parents/caregivers. These individual applications are not processed by the elementary school and must be mailed directly to the high school by the required date published by the school. Some high schools require an application fee and an essay with the individual application.
- Admissions decisions for applying 8th grade students will be announced on February 15, 2012. Students applying after February 15, 2012 should contact the Catholic high school(s) of choice to ask about available space and late admissions procedures.

Students may take the test at any Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic high school on the dates listed above, however the test may be taken only once. Test results can be sent to three catholic high schools. In the case of inclement weather, visit our web site or tune in to WBAL 1090AM for instructions.
- Applicants must complete an individual application for the Catholic high school(s) of their choice. The school(s) may also have other application procedures including record release documents, fees and other requirements. Contact the school(s) of choice for the specifics regarding application procedures.
- Admissions decisions for applying 8th grade students will be announced on February 15, 2012. Students applying after February 15, 2012 should contact the Catholic high school(s) of choice to ask about available space and late admissions procedures.
- 4. Scholarships, financial aid, and work study grants for applying 8th grade students will not be announced, formally or informally, prior to February 15, 2012. Contact the individual high schools for specific information.
- 5. Accepted students must adhere to the registration deadline provided by the high school.
- 6. Questions about the application process should be directed to the high schools (phone numbers are listed on the directory pages contained in this Guide).
- 7. Students are encouraged to attend Open Houses held at all Catholic high schools during the fall. A list of Open House dates is included in this booklet on page 32.

Admissions-Recruitment Procedures for the Catholic High Schools in the Archdiocese of Baltimore

High School Decision Notification Date: February 15, 2012 High School Registration Date: March 7, 2012

Prior to Admissions Decisions:

- For admission consideration, no other recommendation besides the Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic High School Information Form will be required of Catholic elementary/middle schools. Additional recommendations may be required for scholarship applicants.
- 2. Each high school administration is responsible for educating their school community about Admissions-Recruitment Procedures of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, individual school admission procedures, as well as policies of other organizations that may affect the Recruitment-Admissions process.
- 3. Admissions Directors may contact individual school principals to give information only about their high school. No classroom visitations/student presentations may be made unless they are a part of the established schedule or visits approved by the Department of Catholic Schools. (The exception to this would be parish high schools. Staff from a parish high school may visit the parish elementary/middle school at any time.)
- 4. No Catholic high school will communicate decisions concerning admissions (acceptance; denial; wait list; scholarship and/or financial aid) for current 8th graders verbally or in writing prior to the established February decision deadline date.
- 5. No Catholic high school may communicate any scholarship or financial aid decision before the February decision deadline date.

At the Time of Admissions Decisions:

- 6. All Catholic high schools will mail decision letters and notify applicants on the established February decision deadline date.
- 7. All Catholic high school admissions directors must notify Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic elementary/middle school principals of admission decisions about their students prior to 8:00 a.m. on the first school day after the decision deadline. This may be done by way of telephone, fax, or e-mail; an e-mail directly to the elementary school principal is the preferred method.
- 8. Schools receiving complete applications from prospective students shall respond to all applicants in writing.

Admissions-Recruitment Procedures for the Catholic High Schools in the Archdiocese of Baltimore

High School Decision Notification Date: February 15, 2012 High School Registration Date: March 7, 2012

After Admissions Decisions:

- 9. Once the decision letters have been mailed, there will be a three week "welcome period." During this time:
 - a) Schools may initiate contact with all of their accepted and wait-listed students; high schools may hold receptions/registration events.
 - b) Schools that accept a wait-listed student should remind the family to contact any other school where the family may also have deposited a registration fee.
- 10. Although individual schools may extend their registration period for as long as they deem necessary, three weeks after the mailing of decision letters will mark the official end of the Catholic high school registration period. Until the end of the three week time period, no Catholic high school may rescind its offer of admission due to space limitations if all registration requirements have been met.

Other General Procedures:

- 11. No high school will allow an accepted Catholic school student to begin the school year unless he/she has successfully completed the eighth grade curriculum and the school has received a final official transcript.
- 12. When receiving an application from a transfer student, the school should contact the applicant's current high school's chief administrator before offering admission.
- 13. Financial obligations from the prior school must be met before the student can begin class.
- 14. No Catholic high school may schedule shadow days for Catholic school students during the week of Archdiocesan elementary standardized testing.
- 15. All grade 9 applicants are expected to take the High School Placement Test on the published December date for admission consideration. The High School Placement Test may be taken only once.

Information for Students Currently in 9th, 10th and 11th Grades

Applying 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students should contact the Catholic high school(s directly about space availability and application procedures. Application requirements and deadlines for upper class students vary from school to school.

Instructions for Completing the Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic High School Information Form

(This form is to be completed only by students who are currently enrolled as 8th grade students in a Catholic elementary school in the Archdiocese of Baltimore)

- Every Catholic elementary school 8th grade student who wishes to attend a Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of Baltimore must complete an Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic High School Information Form. This form will be given directly to students in Catholic elementary schools by personnel at their respective schools no earlier than the week before Thanksgiving. A student may not fill out more than one Information Form. In addition, our Catholic high schools require an individual application specific to and available from each high school.
- 2. Each applicant, with his or her parent/caregiver, must complete the appropriate section as instructed on the form. The student and parent/caregiver must sign the form and return it to the student's elementary school. The parent's/ caregiver's signature indicates that the three circled high schools, as specified on the Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic High School Information Form, are selected with their consent, and that the elementary school has permission to release the student's records to the designated schools. The remaining section of the Information Form is then completed by middle school teachers and the principal from the student's school.
- 3. After the Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic High School Information Form is complete, the elementary school will make copies of the form to send directly to the three selected schools with a copy of the student's standardized testing results (6th to 8th grades) and the student's 6th, 7th and 8th grade academic records. The elementary school may retain the original form.
- 4. High schools will send a list of decisions to the elementary schools at the same time the decision letters are mailed to the students on or shortly after February 15, 2012.

National Guidelines for Documentation of Special Learning Needs

The presence of an IEP, 504 Plan, or professional evaluation does not necessarily mean that a student is eligible for extended time testing or other special testing accommodations.

Documentation to support the need for requested accommodations must:

A

- 1. State the specific disability as diagnosed, using a DSM IV classification.
- 2. Be current (in most cases, the evaluation must be no older than two years).
- 3. Provide complete educational, developmental, and relevant medical history.
- 4. Describe the comprehensive testing and techniques used to arrive at the diagnosis (including evaluation(s) date(s) and test results with subtest scores from measures of cognitive ability, current academic achievement, and information processing).
- **5. Describe the specific accommodations requested,** and state why the disability qualifies the student for such accommodations.
- 6. Establish the professional credentials of the evaluator, including information about license or certification and area of specialization.

COEDUCATIONAL

Archbishop Spalding High School

The *Aquinas Program* supports uniquely gifted college-bound students who have learning differences in the areas of reading and language (additional fee applies).

The John Carroll School

The Enhance Program provides an opportunity to develop and/or maintain competence in study skills, listening skills, and test-taking skills.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel School

The U.S.S. STAR Program provides an opportunity for students who have difficulty attending, have earned marginal grades in the past, have a documented learning difference, or have indicated a need for a stronger support system in order to achieve educational success.

MEN

Archbishop Curley High School

The Franciscan Program is an interdisciplinary program for students to participate in honors level courses, which emphasize effective speaking and writing skills. *The Cupertino Program* is a college preparatory academic program for students working at the appropriate grade level. A student's placement within the program is evaluated on a regular basis to ensure a challenging and appropriate curriculum. *The Anthony Program* is a multifaceted college preparatory program that addresses the needs of young men of diverse backgrounds who are at risk for academic difficulties due to a learning difference, lower self-esteem, and/or socio-emotional issues. Maximum learning potential is achieved through the implementation of cross-curricular behavioral strategies, individualized assessments to measure academic performance, and most importantly, an integrated team-teaching approach.

Calvert Hall College High School

The La Salle Program serves a unique group of students with identified learning disabilities. Students in this program may encounter problems in reading, writing and math skills due to a specific language disability such as dyslexia. Students are integrated into the academic and extra-curricular environment, but to address the unique learning characteristics of these students, their academic programs are tailored to meet their individual needs.

Loyola Blakefield

The Murray Learning Service supports bright, motivated students with documented learning differences as they complete the rigorous college preparatory program at Loyola Blakefield. This fee-for-service program provides unlimited access to a team of Learning Specialists who work with the students to improve organizational and time management skills, provide appropriate accommodations, and assist the students in meeting the demands of their classroom teachers.

Mount Saint Joseph High School

The DePaul Program is designed for college-bound students with specifically diagnosed mild learning/language disabilities such as dyslexia, dysgraphia, or other language-related difficulties. *The Ryken Program* is a program for students who have received low scores on standardized tests and/or have struggled in previous academic work. They may also be on to two levels below grade level in math, reading, or writing skills.

WOMEN

The Catholic High School of Baltimore

The Archangel Program provides an opportunity for success to students who have encountered academic difficulties during elementary and middle school. Through small class sizes and frequent student-teacher interaction, close cooperation between home and school, and the student's commitment to success, the successful Archangel student will begin the College Preparatory Program in her junior year. Archangels in the Class of 2015 will experience specialized, small class sizes in all core courses through their junior year.

The Seton Keough High School

The Marillac Program is for young women who welcome the challenge of a college-prep program but have a learning difference that compromises their ability to access curriculum in a conventional way. These young women benefit from the comprehensive program of study at Seton Keough High School, along with the support services available to them in the areas of work/study, reading, writing and math skills.

Marion I. and Henry J. Knott were firm believers in the value of Catholic education and hoped to see the best and the brightest Catholic scholars attend area Catholic schools. To this end, they established the Knott Scholarship Funds.

The Knott Scholarship Funds award four-year, full-tuition scholarships to attend parish Catholic elementary schools and Catholic high schools located in Baltimore City, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford and Howard counties. These scholarships honor Catholic students who excel in academics. The following information applies to those seeking secondary scholarships. If you have a Catholic student in Grade 4, please see the Knott website, *www.knottscholar.org*, for elementary scholarship information.

To apply for a Knott Secondary Scholarship, the student must meet all of the criteria described below. If the student does not meet all of the criteria, please do not apply.

- ✓ Student must be in eighth grade at time of application.
- ✓ Student must be a baptized Catholic or convert officially received into the Catholic Church by a priest.
- ✓ Student and family legally reside in one of these areas of the Archdiocese of Baltimore: Baltimore City, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, or Howard counties. If you reside outside of these areas, you are not eligible to apply for these scholarships.
- ✓ Student and family are registered in a Catholic parish in one of the above-mentioned areas.
- Student is an eighth grader in a Catholic, public, private, or home school and is applying for admission into a Catholic high school in one of the above geographic areas. Student will be asked to provide proof of acceptance from a Catholic high school when submitting a completed Knott scholarship application.
- ✓ Student scores in the 95th percentile or above in Total Reading (Vocabulary and Reading Comprehension subtests), Total Mathematics (Problem Solving and Math Procedures subtests), and Language (Language Mechanics & Language Expression subtests), on a nationally standardized test given at the student's current school in spring of Grade 7 or fall of Grade 8. For students attending a school giving a nationally standardized test in spring of Grade 7, (for Archdiocese of Baltimore Catholic schools, this means the Stanford Achievement Tests) this is the only test result we will accept. We will not accept any private retesting result unless the student is absent from school and has missed one of these sections. In that case, the parent must present proof in the form of a letter from the principal stating the student has missed a portion of the test. The student must then be tested privately in all of the required areas, as the test results must come from the same test.

- ✓ Students who have not taken a nationally standardized test (not Maryland State testing) in spring of Grade 7 or fall of Grade 8, or who have not been tested in all of the areas shown above, must be tested privately if they wish to apply. However, the student may be tested one time only and that is the only test result we will accept. Private test site administrators are given instructions to this effect. Please call our office for complete information.
- ✓ Student's eighth grade first and second trimester or first and second quarter report cards (depending on system used by your school) must show grades in major subjects - Reading/ Literature, English/Writing, Vocabulary/Spelling (Language Arts), Social Studies, Mathematics, Science - to be all A/A+ or 93-100, depending on grading system used. If your school gives individual grades in Language Arts subjects, each subject must meet this A/A+/93-100 requirement. If the student receives a grade of A- and this grade is equal to a number grade below 93, the student is not eligible to apply.
- ✓ Student must take the Archdiocese of Baltimore High School Admissions Test given in December and have a Composite Score in the 95th percentile or above on this test. You will be asked to submit a copy of your test results with your Knott application. If you do not take this exam or if your composite score is below the 95th percentile, you are not eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Complete Knott Scholarship application information for the 2011-2012 school year and an Application Request Form will be available on the Knott Scholarship website, *www.knottscholar.org.* If you have questions, please call the office, 410-779-1225.

All completed secondary scholarship applications must be in our office no later than 5:00 p.m. Friday, March 25, 2012. Applications received after that date will not be processed regardless of the reason for delay. Announcement of results will be made by letter mailed on or about Monday, April 11, 2012. No information on results will be given by phone or e-mail.
